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Ranuka Rajendram participated in the European Voluntary Service project **SVEA** in **STOCKHOLM, Sweden** between **08/02/2009** and **08/02/2010**.

The following summary of **Ranuka Rajendram's** learning outcome is the result of an ongoing dialogue process between **Ranuka Rajendram** and her mentor **Charlotta Öberg** during the whole activity.

The following description of learning outcomes is a reflection related to the Key Competences for lifelong learning recommended by the European Parliament and the Council in December 2006.

Communication in mother tongue

The mother tongue - Danish, had an indeed important part for the volunteer during the project period in Sweden. Danish was not only used to personally contact with family and friends in Denmark, but also to learn the foreign language, Swedish.

The Scandinavian languages is said to be very similar, therefore Danish was used to learn the difference of the similarity in the foreign language.

In context of the Nordic school student network, the volunteer has been writing an danish application to co-finance the network. The volunteer has used Danish to communicate with the consultants at Nordbuk - Nordic Children's and Youth Committee. Here the volunteer received consultative help from the co-sponsor.

The volunteer has also been using Danish to the Nordic School Student Network were there was a lot of contact with partner organisations in Denmark and board member of the danish student council organisations.

Communication in foreign languages

Other foreign languages that the volunteer has use is Swedish and English. English has been used to communicate with the partner organisations in the Nordic countries, Finland, Iceland and Norway.
